

Hazard Warning Labels

Shown below is a selection of the most commonly used **GHS** (*Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals*). Hazard labels are used to denote potential health, physical and environmental hazards associated with certain materials and equipment. They draw attention to the need to take precautions with their use. **GHS** is an internationally agreed upon system, created by the United Nations in 2000, and designed to replace the various classification and labeling standards used in different countries.
