How to get a Curative COVID-19 test on Campus

- This is a drive through location only
- Testing is FREE
- Insurance information is requested but not required to get a test
- For same day testing, complete registration questions for same-day testing
- Have your ID ready

Prepare for your

test:

 Arrive in a vehicle with windows for the drive through test center

Results

are typically available within **24-48** hours & sent via email or text.



Testing in the event of an Outbreak in your location

- Employees will be notified by UCR Health or HRBP
- Testing is available free of charge to employees within the exposed group, during work hours
- Testing remains available until there are no new COVID-19 cases detected in the exposed group for a 14-day period
- After notification, testing is **immediately** available to all employees in the exposed group and again one week later.
- After first two tests, continuous tests once per week is available

Minor Outbreaks - 3 or more employee COVID-19 cases within an exposed group visited the workplace during their high-risk exposure period during a 14-day period

 Free testing available for all employees within the exposed group who worked on site during the period of the outbreak

Exceptions:

- Employees who were not present at the workplace during the relevant 14-day period
- Employees who are fully vaccinated and do not have COVID-19 symptoms
- For asymptomatic COVID-19 cases who returned to work according to "When to return to campus", or for 90 days after the initial onset of COVID-19 symptoms, or for COVID-19 cases who never developed symptoms, 90 days after the first positive test

Major Outbreaks - 20 or more employee COVID-19 cases within an exposed group visited the workplace during their high-risk exposure period during a 14-day period

Free testing available for all employees in the exposed group, regardless of vaccination status,
twice a week or more frequently if recommended by Department of Public Health
