

APPENDIX D

Primary Field Safety Responsibilities of Teaching Assistants:

- Read and acknowledge the Field Trip Plan to understand hazards while on a field trip and appropriate prevention and emergency measures.
- Ensure that there is a copy of the Field Trip Safety Sheet with you on the field trip.
- Required attire:
 - Wear long pants or long skirts that cover legs (no shorts, dresses, or short skirts) and closed toe/heel shoes that have traction (ballet-style slippers or sandals are not permitted). It is your responsibility to make sure that the students do the same too.
 - o Wear a hat and apply sunscreen or wear a long-sleeve shirt.
 - Bring at least a liter of water
- Accidents and Reporting:
 - Attend to injury immediately. Request help, if necessary, from the instructor or the site contact listed in the field safety form.
 - First aid equipment is available in the First Aid Kit. Instructions for dealing with most medical issues are in the Field Trip Safety Sheet.
 - o For emergencies, call 9-1-1
 - Notify EH&S at (951) 827-5528 or Report an Incident, Injury or Safety Concern at https://ehs.ucr.edu/report. As soon as possible and within 24 hours
 - Report accidents to individual in charge of the course
- Emergencies:
 - Familiarize yourself with the Emergency medical information listed on Field Trip Safety
 Sheets. Including:
 - Call 9-1-1
- Safety equipment:
 - Make sure that you and your students know the location of nearest: first aid kit, evacuation route.
- Supervision:
 - Make sure the students do not wander off on their own during a field trip and they always stay on designated trails.
- Know, follow and enforce the policies and procedures for the following:
 - Responding to students or staff who have mental health problems. Refer to UCR RED Folder: https://studentdocs.ucr.edu/counseling/uc-riverside caps red folder.pdf
 - Assisting students and staff for injuries, fainting, or other physical health problems.

While **preparing** to conduct a field trip, consider the following questions:

- O Where is the first aid kit?
- O How do I respond if a student had an incident?
- O What are the safety considerations?

During the field trip:



Wear proper personal protective equipment (long pants, closed toe/heels shoes) and assess that all students are wearing the same level of PPE as you.

- Safety Consciousness
 - o Give your safety orientation talk to your students before they do any field work. Warn them of particular hazards before each field trip.
 - o Review safety issues for the experiment.
