Hazard Warning Labels

Shown below is a selection of the most commonly used GHS (Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labeling of Chemicals). Hazard labels are used to denote potential health, physical and environmental hazards associated with certain materials and equipment. They draw attention to the need to take precautions with their use. GHS is an internationally agreed upon system, created by the United Nations in 2000, and designed to replace the various classification and labeling standards used in different countries.
